Would monitor post school employment and education to establish efficacy of the intervention

Cut in federal budget cuts

California Transition Services Requirements

Required to provide a coordinated set of activities that leads to post-school goals of the student

Transition Plan must be in place

- Last IEP in place before the student turns 16 years old
- May be in place as soon as grade 8
 - Alternate Diploma

Required to assess students for aptitude and interests and consider family input:

- Employment
- Education
- Independent Living (?)

Bridge Program for students aged 18-22

Paid internships for up to 30 students for up to 100 hours

Internships include offsite and onsite opportunities



Department of Rehabilitation

Student benefits include:

- experience what it is like to work with the site
- learn how to appropriately engage with other employees and customers
- learn work etiquette and expectations
- earn a paycheck
- learn the value of money and puts budgeting into perspective

Employer benefits include:

- seeing the abilities of the students as employees
- identify accessible accommodations that enable all people to work successfully



Alternate Diploma

Alternate diploma awarded to students who complete the state required state standards aligned coursework and who are eligible to take the alternate state assessment.

Bridge Program


11 out of 23 school completers this year will receive the alternate diploma
