




Graduates Meeting UC/CSU Requirements





LCFF Priority #3: Parent Engagement

• CA Healthy Kids Survey:

88% of parents/guardians agreed with the statement, "My child's school encourages me to be an active partner with the school in educating my child." (2017-18*)

- 29% of sites had a representative attend a Parent Advisory Committee meeting (2016-17*)
- 39% of sites had a representative attend a District English Learner Advisory Committee meeting (2016-17*)

LCFF Priority #6: Climate Survey

•CA Healthy Kids Survey:

76% of elementary and 65% of secondary students agreed with the statement, "I feel like I am part of this school."*

Chronic absenteeism rate 8% - a 1% decrease

•Attendance rate 95.8% - .3% increase

* Increase of 13% for secondary students



Indicator Highlights

- Increase in percentage of first graders scoring on or above grade level in ELA and math on the midyear iReady diagnostic
- Increase in redesignation rates for English learners
- Increase in low income, Hispanic and EL students meeting UC/CSU requirements
- Increased the of number of 9th graders and those who are African American, low income, special education, English Learner, and Hispanic students who are on track for graduation.

- 8% increase in the number of grade 3 students meeting or exceeding standards on CAASPP-ELA
- Decrease in Chronic Absenteeism
- Parents/guardians continue to participate in advisory committees



Future program implications

- Priority standards identification and development of curricular guides
- Common assessments being instituted at all levels
- Establish consistent and regular data analysis protocols
- Intense focus on classroom walk-throughs
- Expand study lab classrooms for professional development
- AVID at all levels with a focus on instructional equity
