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Proposition

The Addition of a Student to the MDUSD Board of Education

Purpose:

- To provide students with a voice on the Board of Education
- Student would receive preferential Voting Rights. Vote does not affect the numerical outcome of a BOE vote
- Student would have the ability to make motions





Rationale

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Students want to be agents of change

2 Students have first-hand experience that decision makers need

- This would help strengthen contact & communication between the Board of Education and Students
- With so many students in MDUSD, this would help strengthen implementation of student ideas

Project objective



A student board member would give MDUSD students a liaison to represent them in front of a governing body and provide actionable pathways towards the direct voicing and solving of student concerns.



Equity and Access to Information



Students

-PA announcement for all the high schools during application season -information on school website

Educators

- -Supt. could email all 11th grade teachers
- Information emailed to all school principals
- Teachers asked to make class announcement

Parents

- -Weekly email blast sent out to all parents containing information
- -Info on PFC websites

Appointment Process

- Preliminary application process with supplementary short answer questions, at least one teacher recommendation, transcripts, and list of extracurriculars
- An ad-hoc committee made up of members on the district board could review these applications and narrow down the pool to an interview conducted by said ad-hoc committee, assuming the incoming pool is not too large



Rights of the Student Member



- Preferential vote: expression of preference cast before the official vote that is recorded in the minutes but does not affect the outcome of the numerical vote
- The board can make its own bylaws as to whether the student can make or second motions or add items to the consent calendar, etc
- The student board member gets all documents and materials in open session matters in a timely manner, not including closed sessions


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AB 261 (d)

- (1) There may be submitted to the governing board of a school district maintaining one or more high schools a pupil petition requesting the governing board to appoint one or more pupil members to the governing board pursuant to this section.
- (2) The petition shall contain the signatures of either (A) not less than 500 pupils regularly enrolled in high schools of the school district, or (B) not less than 10 percent of the number of pupils regularly enrolled in high schools of the school district, whichever is less. Each fiscal year, and within 60 days of receipt of a petition for pupil representation, or at its next regularly scheduled meeting if no meeting is held within those 60 days, the governing board of a school district shall order the inclusion within the membership of the governing board, in addition to the number of members otherwise prescribed, at least one pupil member. The governing board of a school district may order the inclusion of more than one pupil member.



Sample Questions

- 2. Why do you want to serve on the Mt. Diablo Unified Board of Education? (Please limit your response to 150 words.)

Guidelines



- The sitting student board member would have preferential voting rights as recorded in the minutes
- Cannot vote in carrying out a motion, per California law
- Board members should take this vote into consideration when casting their votes
- All resources and material available to board members must be available to the student representative in a timely manner, so that they have time to prepare.
- MDUSD can make its own bylaws, such as giving the student member the right to make and second motions or object to something on the consent calendar.





Duties of the student Governing Board member include the following:

- -To attend all scheduled Board meetings, except closed sessions
- -To provide continuing input for Board deliberations
- -To strengthen communications between the Board and district students
- -To represent all students and facilitate the discussion of all sides of issues. This duty does not preclude the student Board member from stating his/her individual opinion



Commitment:

The term of student Board member shall be July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Te student Board member shall attend all regular Board meetings, except closed session Meetings are typically on Wednesday evenings. The student Board member would need to arrive by 6:30 pm and meetings typically end between 9:00 and 10:00 pm.



Role:

The student Board member shall be seated with regular Board members and be recognized at meetings as a full member. They may participate in question presenters and discuss issues and shall receive all materials presented to Board members except those related to closed sessions and personnel matters.

The student Board member may cast preferential votes and make motions on most matters that may be acted upon by the Board.





Qualifications:

- -A student must hold and maintain a minimum 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale
- -A student must maintain minimum progress toward meeting high school graduation requirements
- A student must have and maintain satisfactory citizenship (behavior)





Selection Process:

- -Step 1: Candidates will apply for the position by completing the online application
- -Step 2: Each comprehensive school will select one applicant from the submitted applications to be the school site's finalist for the position. As part of the school finalist selection process, applicants will participate in an interview with representatives of their school administration and elected student body
- Step 3: School site finalists will be interviewed by a District panel consisting of student representatives and Board members



Los Angeles USD Example

Selection Process:

- Current LAUSD students who will be 12th graders next school year are eligible to submit an application packet to be considered for the position of student board member.
- 2. Applications will go through a screening committee comprised of District staff and students.
- 3. The screening committee will select candidates to be on the voting slate.
- 4. Student body presidents and one additional elected student leader from each LAUSD high school will be able to cast a vote. In the event that the elected student board member is not able to perform their duties, the alternate will serve as the student board member.


