Why begin with arts?

- Our Foundation vision is quality education for all students, regardless of their zip code. Overall we aim to fund STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, math) enrichment and career technical opportunities.
- Our first donation was \$30,000 from MDEA Academy Awards, dedicated to elementary school arts. Those funds enable us to launch art programs this year! We began by surveying arts in our schools – what exists and what is wished for. This report shows what we learned.



- 127 responses
- 29 of 31 elementary schools responded


Our state does not fund arts in education, so:

- In some schools, parent groups manage parent-led art classes, fund art supplies, and organize fee-based afterschool drama and art programs.

Community in our Schools

- Free resources exist that some schools have tapped into, such as Bedford Gallery's Art in a Suitcase.
- Art curricula with grade level specific Common Core aligned hands-on projects have been successful in some schools, such as Art in Action or Meet the Masters.
 - These require ongoing funding and teachers or volunteers who are willing to teach art.
