


 - Others




What is an EL Master Plan?

Defines optimally effective programs for ELs


 Ensures that EL programs are appropriate to the unique conditions of the Mt. Diablo USD

Responsive to student, parent and community needs




What is an EL Master Plan?

- Helps ensure that district programs and services to ELs are consistent with state and federal law, but,
- It does not merely state the law.




Why is an EL Master Plan Needed?

- The district contracted an audit of programs and services to English Learners. The audit report was provided in May 2011.
- Selected findings:
 - There is wide variation in implementation of programs and services
 - Essential components of high quality EL programs are not in place or consistently implemented.
 - Resources are not aligned for the most effective implementation of EL programs.



The Master Plan Task Force

- Began work in September 2011
- Includes about 40 teachers, parents, administrators, district representatives and other community members
- Will meet 8 times and conclude its work March 15, 2012.




Role of the Master Plan Task Force

The Task Force is advisory to the Superintendent

- Task Force develops and reaches consensus on the Master Plan March 2012.
- Superintendent and staff review and may modify the plan
- Superintendent submits Plan to Board of Trustees for adoption in April or May 2012


Contents of the Draft EL Master Plan

- Chapter 6: Evaluation and Accountability
- Chapter 7: Funding
