Goal # 2


High quality, culturally proficient, and responsive staff will provide engaging instruction respectful of all students' backgrounds to ensure they are college and career ready.

Elementary Summer School Highlights



- 14 Elementary Sites served students in 1st 3rd grade, 8:00AM 12:00PM
- Bel Air, Cambridge, El Monte, Meadow Homes, Rio Vista, Sun Terrace and Wren added Kindergarten and Fourth Graders to their Summer School Program
- There were an additional 27 Extended School Year classrooms located across seven of the sites listed above
- Eight classrooms across Bancroft, Cambridge and Meadow Homes provided Spanish language instruction
- Fifth grade students were invited to attend summer programs at the middle schools
- Seven schools were identified as Community Feeding Schools
- All sites served Second Chance Breakfast every day

Middle School Summer School Highlights

- Sessions were either 2 or 4 weeks
- Focus on successful orientation of incoming 6th graders
- Focus on schoolwide AVID strategies & AVID Weekly resources
- Heavy emphasis on SEL and the use of non-fiction text
- Focus on community building










