

CLASS TITLE: CHILD ATTENDANT II

DEFINITION: Under general supervision, provides care for infants through preschool age children of parents who are earning their high school diplomas; the incumbent may ~~work variable hours depending on the scheduling of parent involvement functions; will be working with programming designed to stimulate and encourage each child's development by following federal and state guidelines;~~ and performs other related duties as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

- Under the supervision of the site administrator, assumes a leadership role in the program and daily operating decisions
- Developmental screenings: Brigance once a year, and DRDPs (Desired Results Developmental Profiles) three (3) times a year
- Provider/parent conference to share results of developmental profiles
- Assist with developing individual plans to address areas where children are behind in their development
- Assist with planning weekly lessons/themes for all groups in the room
- Responsible to see that health and safety guidelines are followed
- Responsible for monitoring inside and outside environment
- Coordinating needed materials and equipment orders
- ~~Nurtures and cares for infant to preschool aged children~~
- Provides a nurturing rich environment for social, emotional and developmental growth
- ~~Sets up play areas for children with crafts and toys~~
- ~~Reads stories, sings songs, plays records, listens to and talks with children.~~
- Serves snacks and cleans up
- Maintains appropriate daily health log and attendance records of children receiving care
- Sanitize toys, cribs, and other items which a child can put in their mouth
- Performs related duties as assigned

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

Training and Experience: A combination of training and experience equivalent to graduation from high school; twelve early childhood education (ECE) units; possession of the knowledge, skills and abilities listed below; recent successful experience working with groups of children from infancy to age eight.

- Desired - Eighteen (18 or more) Early Childhood Education Units
Required – At least three (3) units infant/toddler (6 units preferred)
Preferred courses: Child, Family and Community
Child Development and Psychology
Program Development

Curriculum Development

- Child Development Permit – Associate Teacher

Knowledge of:

- Working with preschool children in groups
- Early childhood education

Skill in:

- Establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with others
- Oral and written communication

Ability to:

- Understand the needs of young children and a sincere liking for children
- Communicate orally and in writing
- ~~Have the mobility to perform the duties of the position with or without accommodation~~

Physical Requirements:

Sitting or standing for extended periods of time; sitting on floor; ability to lift up to 40 lbs.; ability to bend, kneel, reach for and carry students.
