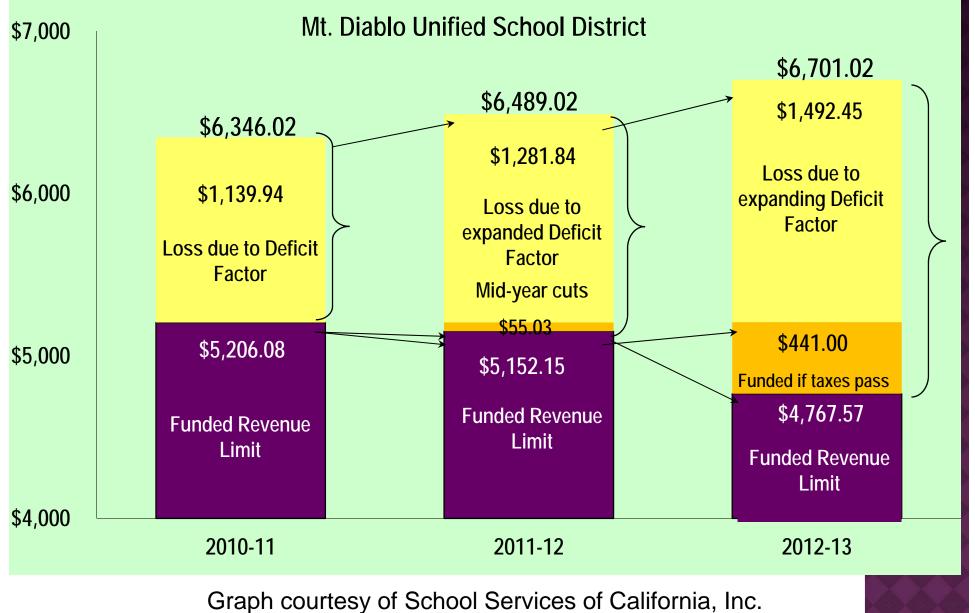

COLA, DEFICITS AND TRIGGERS

- A 3.243% COLA; \$212 per ADA
 - COLA 100% deficited bringing deficit to 22.272%
- Prior year mid-year cut is reversed putting funded revenue limit at \$5,208.57 out of \$6,701.02 that it should be per ADA
- A mid-year trigger cut of \$441/ADA to the revenue limit (raising deficit factor to approximately 28.853%) happens if Governor Brown's tax measure fails

FUNDED REVENUE LIMIT



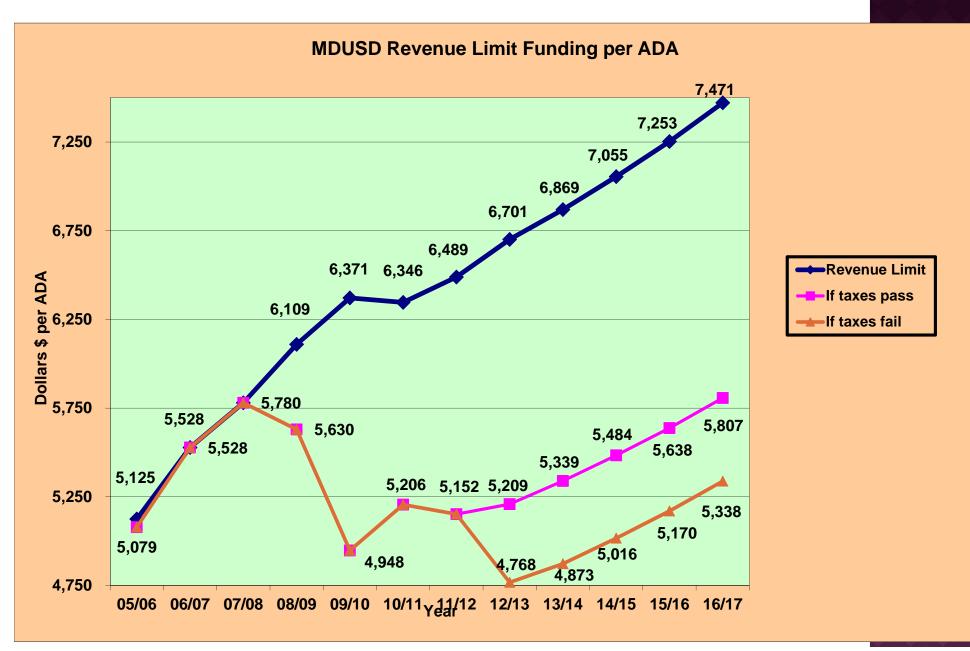

DECLINING ENROLLMENT

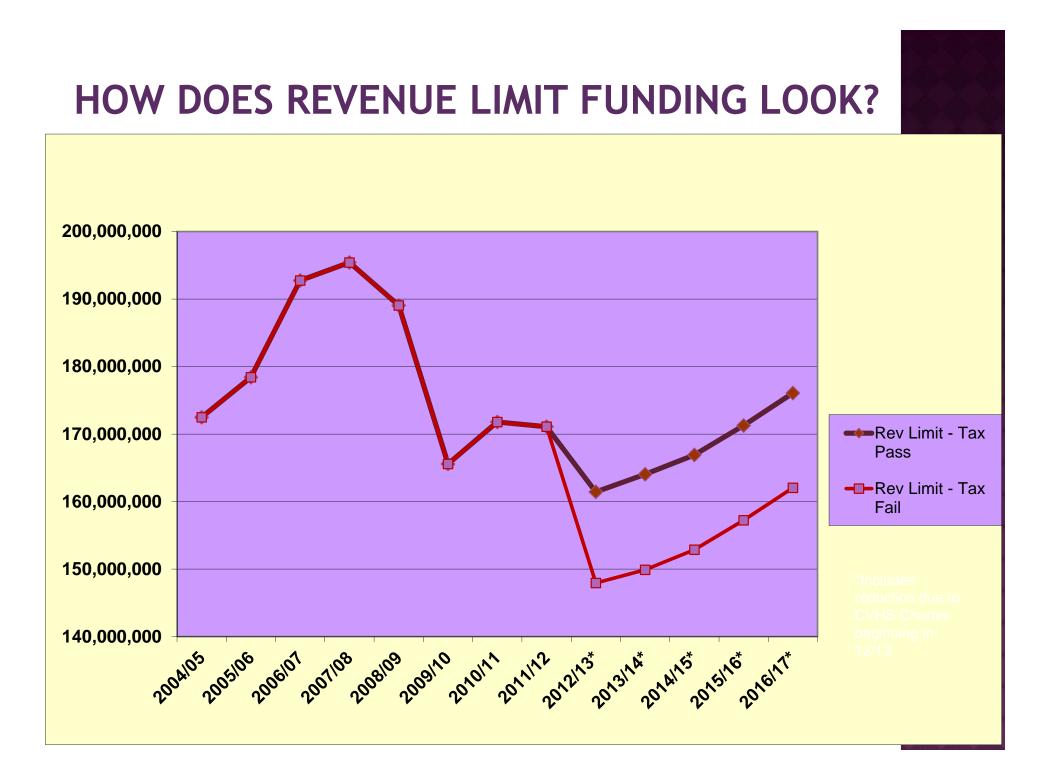
- We are still declining in enrollment

MDUSD ENROLLMENT DECLINING!





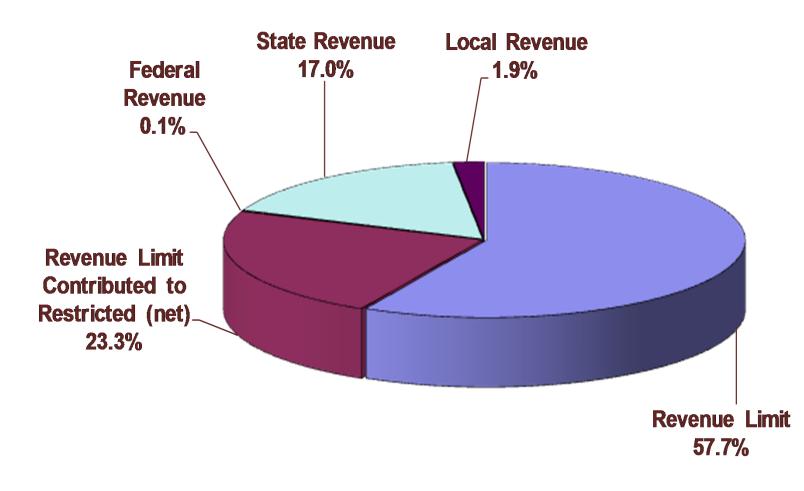

Mt. Diablo Unified School District Unrestricted General Fund Revenues Before Contributions 2012-13 Total = \$189,336,316



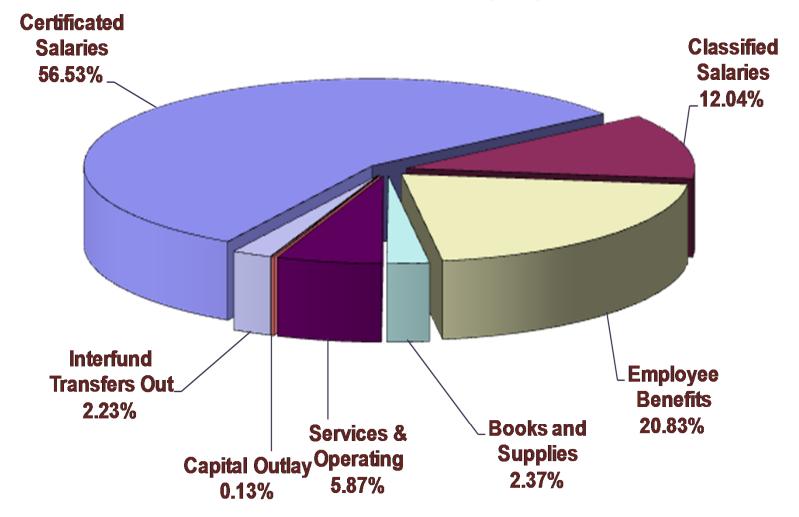

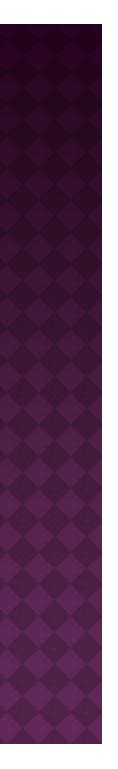

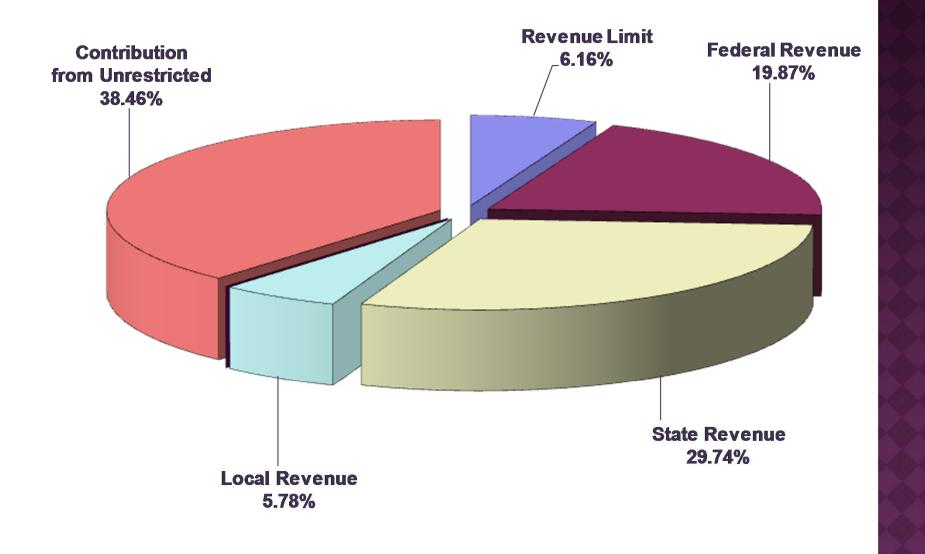

Mt. Diablo Unified School District Restricted General Fund Revenue 2012/13 Total = \$118,794,982



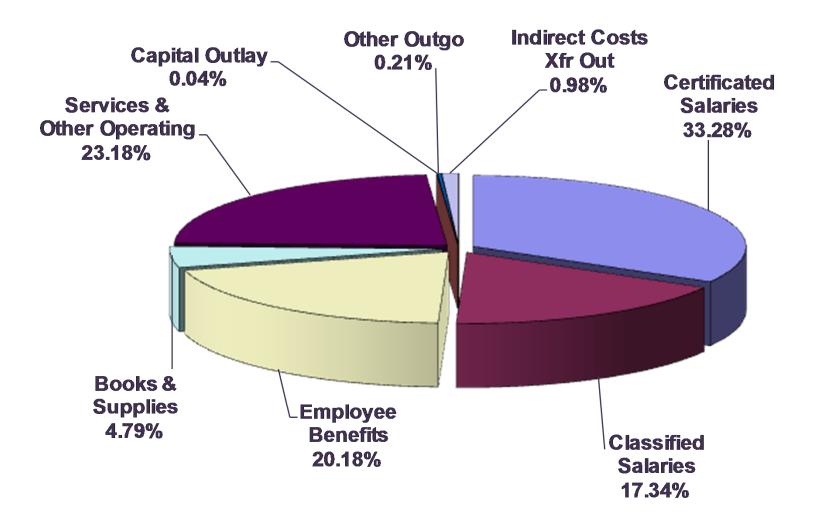

If this were an interim report, we would be qualified. We must address at first interim. Also, we become a 3% reserve district in 2014-15 if enrollment decline continues.

WHERE ARE WE NOW?

- The Board will have to begin discussions to deal with the ongoing deficit issues for first interim this year.
- The State's failure to fund the COLA and increase the deficit for a fifth consecutive year makes it very difficult to keep up with cost pressures.
- The budget relies on getting the COLA starting in 2013/14 and that is an iffy proposition.
- The Solar program is helping to alleviate cost increases in the future years of the multi-year projection.



BUDGET REDUCTION DILEMMA

- Amount of budget reductions needed depends on the answers to the following questions:
 - Will the District's waiver request regarding the funding of Clayton Valley Charter be approved? (\$1.7M)
 - What portion of special education students served at Clayton Valley will come back to the District? (up to \$1M)
 - Will the taxes pass or fail? (\$3M net after furlough days for 2012-13)
 - What recommendations will come forth from the FCMAT studies?
 - Transportation
 - Special Education
 - Will Mental Health Funding stabilize? At what rate? (amount to be determined, but could be up to \$2M)





WHAT NEXT? MORE FROM SACRAMENTO



Legislature passed a budget on June 15th.
 Governor Brown and leadership in legislature have agreed to a compromise budget.
 Budget again has a mid-year cuts contingency.



Initial analysis indicates risk of mid-year cuts of \$441/ADA. School Services update coming July 19th.



MEANWHILE BACK IN CONCORD...

• We must adopt a budget tonight.

- We must keep in mind a contingency if the State doesn't fund the COLA in 2013-14 and beyond (>\$5M additional ongoing cut based on May revise estimates).
- Will the taxes holding the State's new revenue projections together pass?
- Will we have mid-year cuts?
