- Formula for allocating district funding
- Must be driven by data and outcomes

LCAP

Local Control & Accountability Plan

- Spending Plan for the LCFF
- Must align with all other site and district plans



How the LCFF Works

BASE GRANTS

Every student generates a base grant which funds basic educational costs, such as teacher salaries, retirement costs, instructional materials, etc.

SUPPLEMENTAL GRANTS

Students who are SED, EL, Homeless or in Foster Care generate more funding which must be spent on increasing and improving services in order to improve their achievement.

CONCENTRATION GRANTS

To qualify for these funds a district would have to have student populations of at least 55% SED, EL, FY or Homeless.

All school districts must adopt a Local Control & Accountability Plan (LCAP), a 3 year plan for how districts will use state funds to serve all students.



Each district's LCAP must include the following:

- Student achievement indicators
- ✓ Goals
- ✓ Actions
- ✓ Related expenditures



LCAPs must include services that target each major student subgroup, including:

- √ Racial/ethnic subgroups
- ✓ Low-income students
- ✓ English learners
- ✓ Students with disabilities
- ✓ Foster youth
- √ Homeless youth



LCAPs must address the 8 State Priorities*:

- 1. Basic Services
- 2. Implementation of standards
- 3. Parental engagement
- 4. Student achievement
- 5. Student engagement
- 6. School climate
- 7. Access to courses
- 8. Other student outcomes





Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

As required by Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Education Codes 42103, 42127, and 52062, all school districts must develop a three year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP.) The LCAP must be updated every year, be aligned to eight areas identified as state priorities, and describe the school district's overall vision for students, annual goals and specific actions the district will take to achieve the vision and achievement targets. In addition, the LCAP describes how the district's budget will help achieve the goals, and how the district will assess each year how well the strategies in the plan were able to improve outcomes. Mt. Diablo's LCAP addresses college and career readiness, professional learning, engaging parents and community members, and the targeting of support for special populations. These students include foster youth, English learners, low income, and students with disabilities. Over the past 6 months, Council members, advisory groups, and school sites have facilitated meetings with key stakeholder groups providing opportunities for staff, students and community members to provide input on the district's instructional program.



A public hearing will be held on June 10, 2019 to solicit public comment on the 2019-2020 Local Control Accountability Plan. The document will be brought back for approval on June 24, 2019.
