PART I: NATURE OF EMERGENCY (Describe in detail.)

On November 4, 2021 a car accident destroyed a water main adjacent to College Park High School that impacted attendance on November 5, 2021 by more than 10% with overall attendance less than 90%.
 On September 24, 2021, there was a fight after school hours that caused a number of days of unrest on the campus and terroristic threats.
 On September 29, 2021, terrorist threats were made on social media that were later determined to be connected to the fight. Significant numbers of parents did not send their students to school on the days when the threats were circulated: September 30 and October 1, resulting in large material decreases in attendance.

If you chose not to send your student(s) to school because we have no water, the absence will be excused. We are bringing in Porta-Potties to help. Teachers and staff will be on campus.

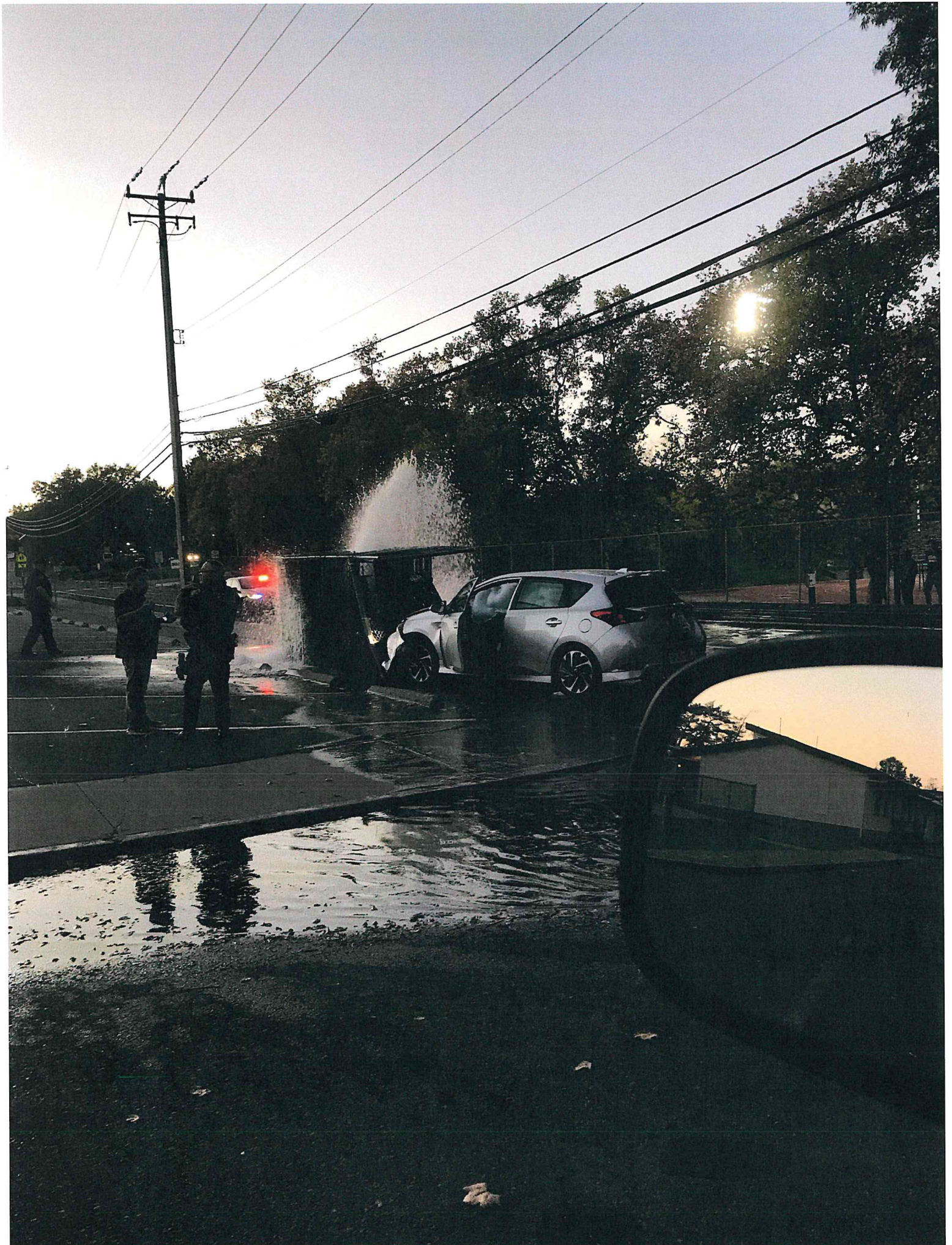

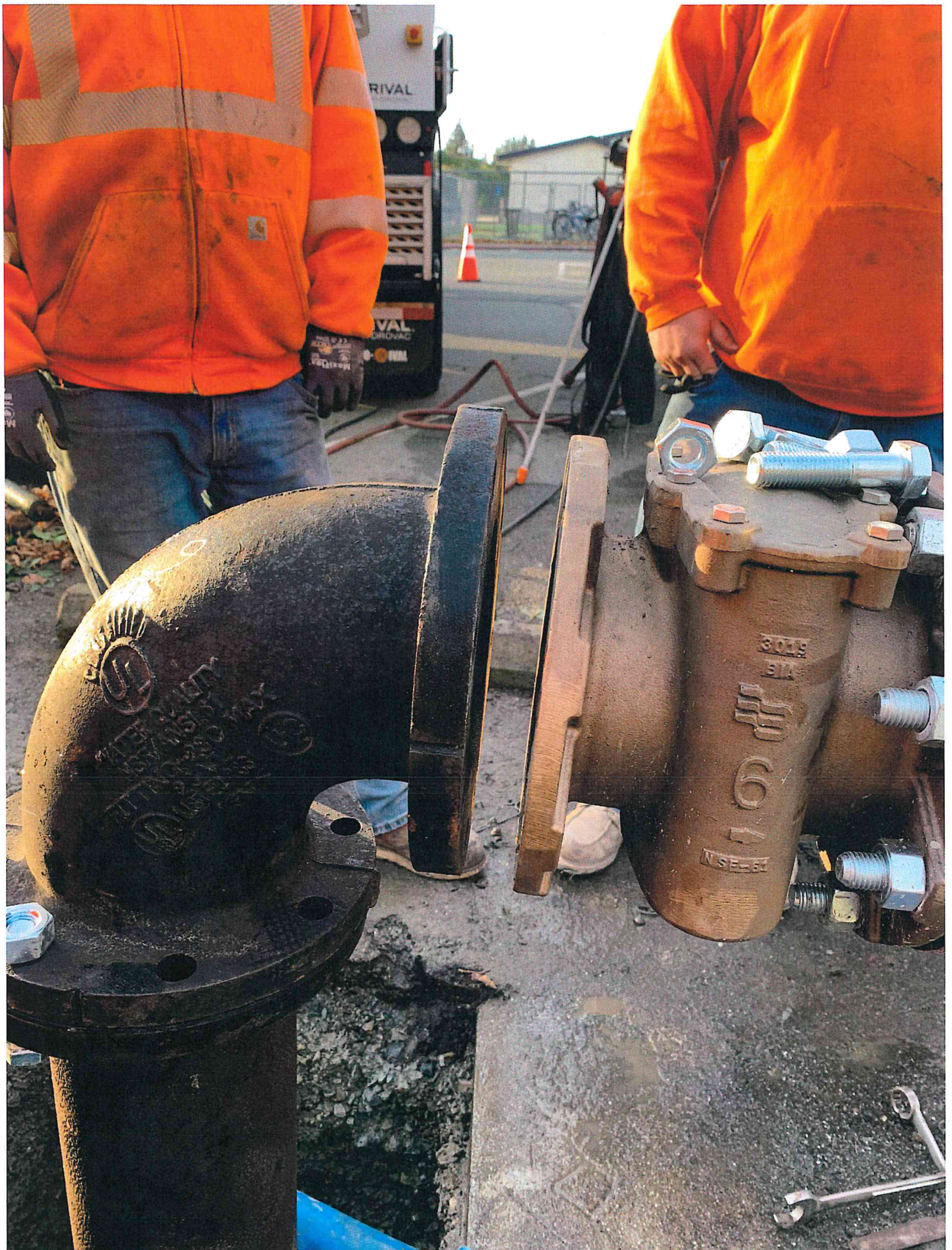
- If your student missed school due to the water issue make sure you call it into the attendance hotline to clear the absence.

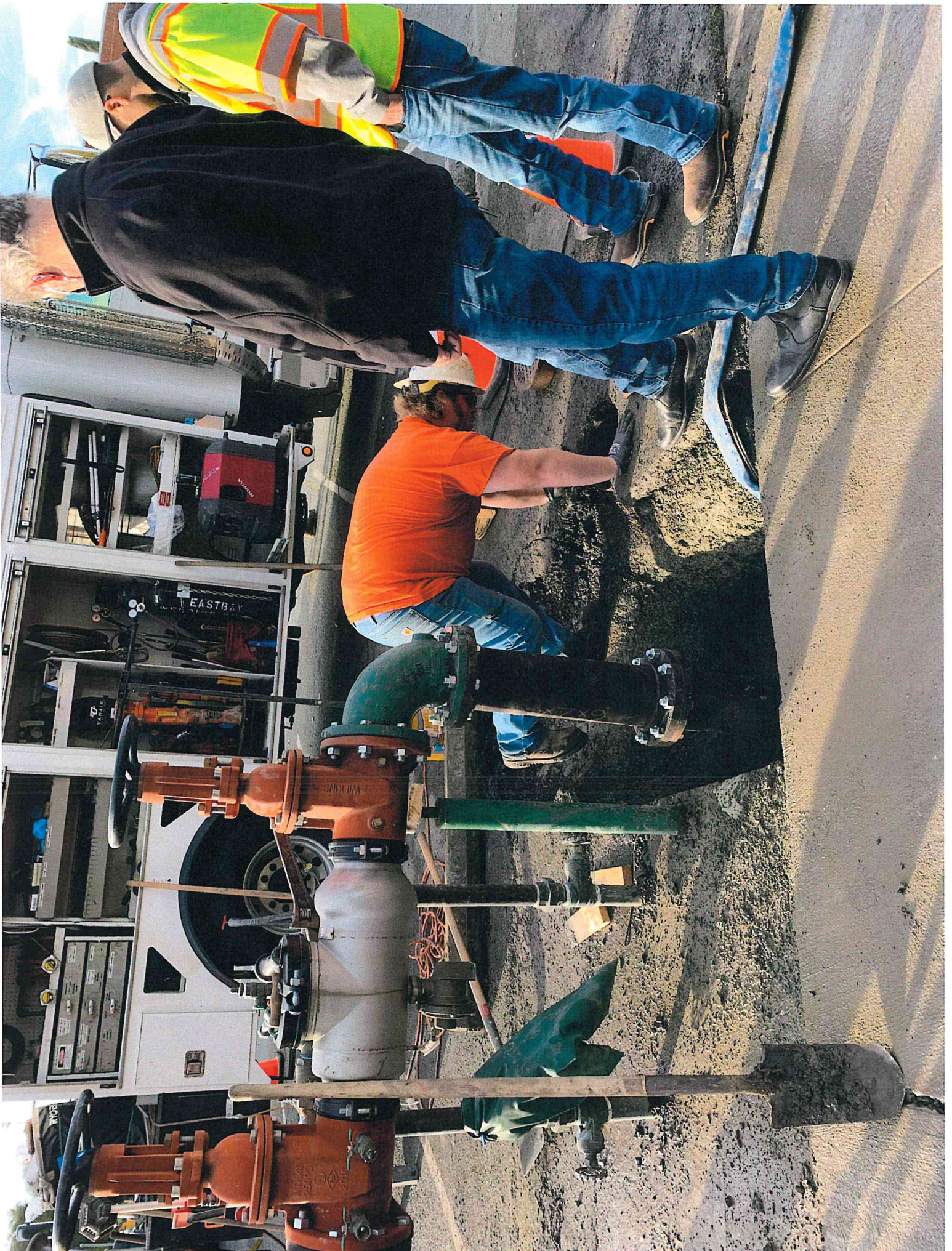

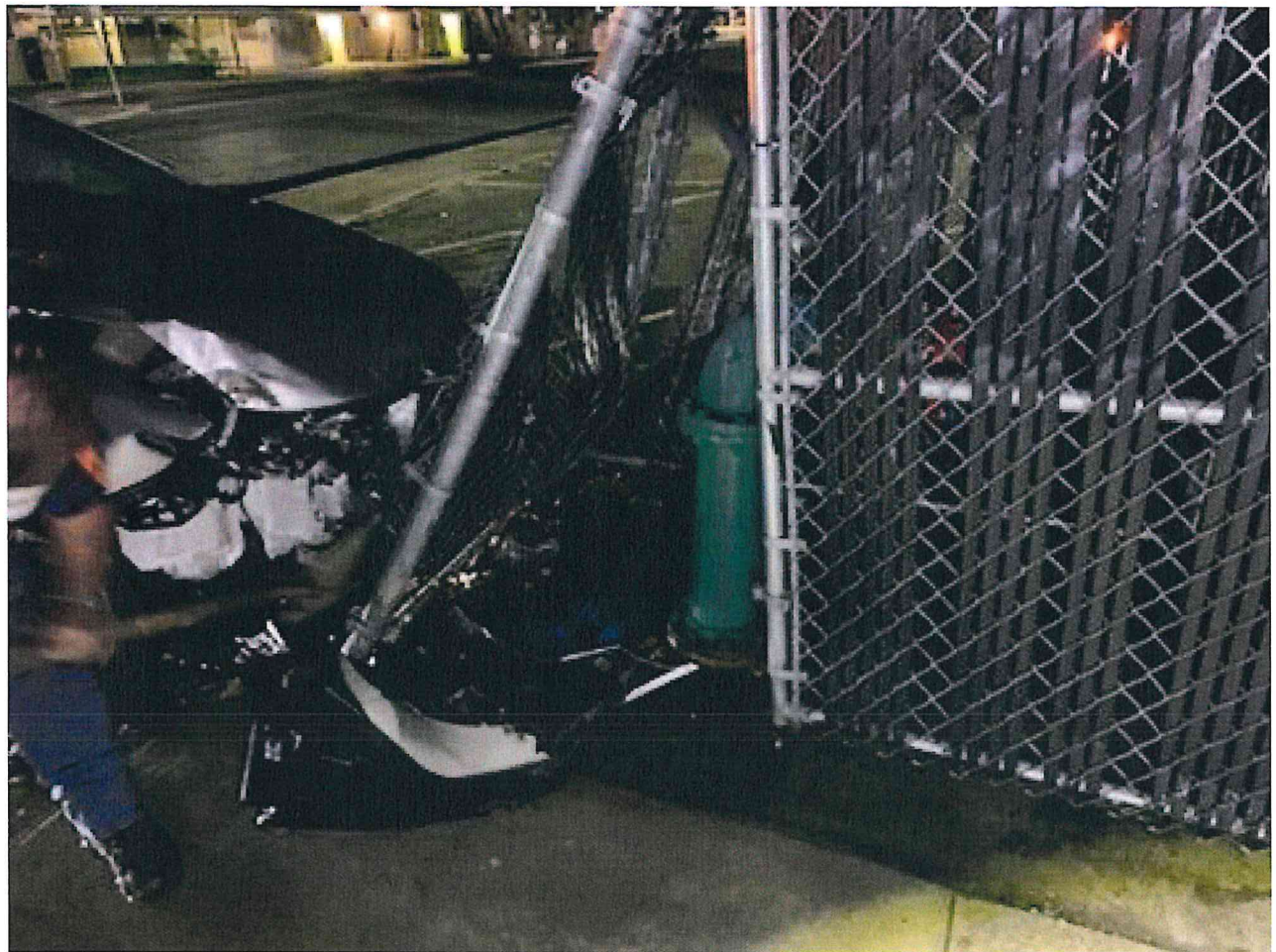

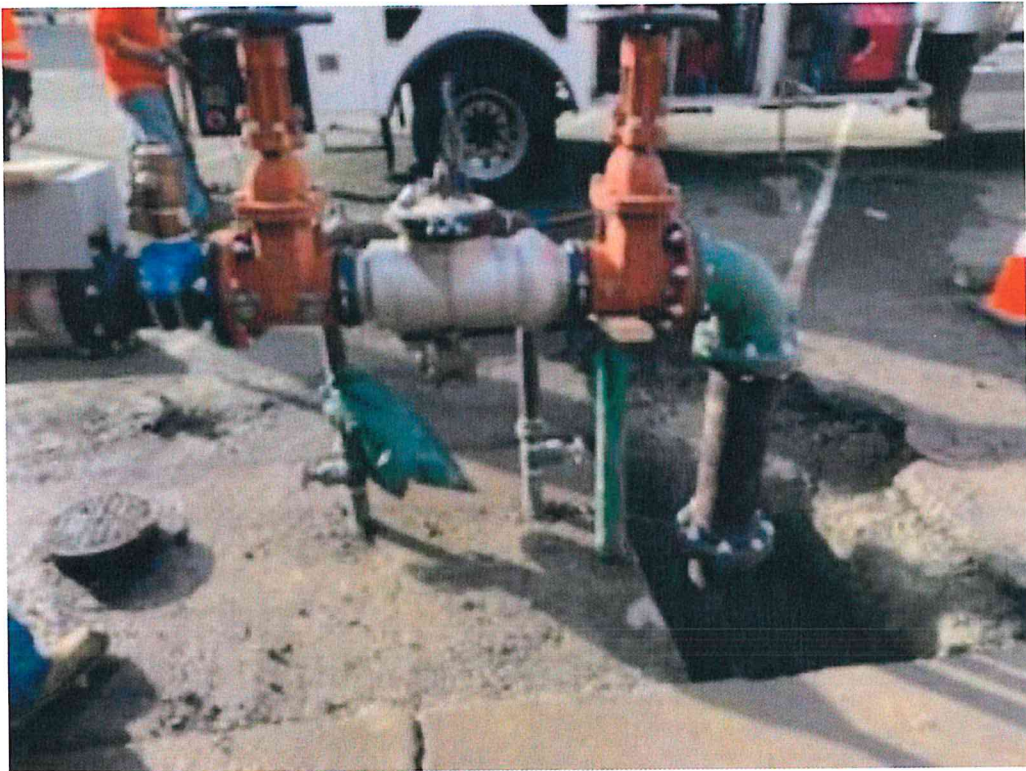

Good afternoon Staff, Students, and Families,

There have been several rumors spreading around our campus, that on Thursday someone is going to "Shoot up" the campus. We have been aware of these rumors and are working with all stakeholders (Staff, Students, District Office, as well as the Concord PD) to address any safety issues that arise.

The District will provide 2 to 3 administrators starting tomorrow. The Concord Police Department is aware of the rumor, and they will make it a point to be available if we need them. Teachers will continue to communicate with administration whenever they hear of any threats. Students and Families are encouraged to share any information they hear that poses a threat to our community.

In closing, safety is always paramount. We give all threats, real or perceived, the attention it deserves. We are aware of the anxiety this has caused our community, counselors will be available to speak to students and staff throughout the day. Thursday and Friday are block days in which we hold an Intervention period during the day. Students are encouraged to talk to their Peak Hours teachers if they need support.

NARRATIVE

NOTIFICATION:

On 9/24/2021, at approximately 1928 hours, multiple people had called 911 and stated there was a large fight at Mt. Diablo High School (2450 Grant St) near the football field. 911 callers advised adults were fighting children and all parties were now separating.

On 9/24/2021, Mt. Diablo High School administrators had called CPD Dispatch twice reporting fights (CH # 89 and 160). Ch #89 was reported to be a large fight involving multiple students in the middle of the school and #160 was reported to be a group of students fighting with parents breaking it up. Both times, school administrators had called CPD Dispatch back requesting Officers cancel as the fights had ended. Officers never responded to the high school.

INVESTIGATION:

On arrival, I contacted two Mt. Diablo High School security officers in the main parking lot. Both of them stated they had not witnessed the fight but heard there was a fight by the football field.

While walking over to the football field, I contacted Courtney Lyon, who is the Vice Principal of Mt. Diablo High School. She stated there was a fight between students and an older white lady but she had actually not witnessed it. She stated the white lady had already left and the students were . Lyon stated she believed the fight happened over the two previous fights that had occurred throughout the day. After approximately 10 minutes of searching, Lyon was able to find two victims of the fight. They were verbally identified as and

I spoke to first. I asked what happened and stated the following in summary:

plays on the or Mt. Diablo High School. stated a friend had called and told there was a fight by the chain link fence (near the locker room) that separates the track/football field and the stands. vent over to the fight and then suddenly was punched with a closed fist to lip region. does not recall if was punched with the suspect's left or right hand. After the suspect punched in the lip, left the scene. The suspect never said anything to never lost consciousness. I asked who the suspect was and said, "I don't even know him". described the suspect as follows: black male, short, unknown weight, with unknown length dread locks, with unknown clothing. does not desire prosecution.

mother's name is and phone number is . She was not on scene and did not respond.

suffered a minor cut to lip region and declined medical attention on scene. I had left my cell phone in my patrol vehicle and so did my partners. Due to this, I did not have a cellphone to take a digital photographs of injury. I took my Axon body camera off of my uniform and put it up to injury to document it.

I then spoke to . I asked him what happened and stated the following in summary:

stated a, "random ass dude came up and socked me" near the concession stands. said was hit once with a closed fist near mouth region. did not lose consciousness. stated never

saw the suspect and was unable to provide a description of him/her. [redacted] stated [redacted] did not know what the fight was about and never saw the suspect who had hit [redacted] does not desire prosecution.

[redacted] mother's name is [redacted] and [redacted] does not know [redacted] phone number. [redacted] was not on scene and did not respond.

[redacted] suffered a swollen lip and declined medical on scene. I had left my cell phone in my patrol vehicle and so did my partners. Due to this, I did not have a cellphone to take a digital photograph of [redacted] injury. I took my Axon body camera off of my uniform and put it up to [redacted] injury to document it.

While I was interviewing [redacted] and [redacted] approached CPD Officers and stated [redacted] had recorded the fight on [redacted] cellphone. [redacted] was sent an evidence.com link to [redacted] cellphone.

While I was on scene, I was unable to locate anyone who had witnessed the fight, as everyone who was still currently on scene, was very uncooperative with my investigation.

I then spoke to Lyon again. Lyon stated she believes the main aggressor to the fight was a student's older sister. The student in question is [redacted]. Lyon believes it is his older sister as she saw her yelling and screaming at a group of students as she was leaving the football field area. Lyon does not know the name of [redacted] sister. [redacted] mother's name is [redacted], and [redacted]. The only description of [redacted] sister Lyon could provide is that she appears to be a white female. Lyon did not witness the fight.

Lyon confirmed there are no video surveillance cameras on the football field or the surrounding areas.

EVIDENCE:

My Axon body camera was activated during the entire incident and was later uploaded to evidence.com.
