**TO: ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND COUNTY SUPERINTENDENTS OF SCHOOLS**

The Office of Administrative Law has approved the emergency regulations pertaining to accepting School Facility Program applications once bond authority has been exhausted, effective November 1, 2012.

All applications received on or after the effective date will be subject to the new regulations and processing procedures as approved by the State Allocation Board (SAB). The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) will no longer be fully processing New Construction or Modernization applications or present the applications to the SAB for approval. The applications will undergo an intake review to ensure all of the required documents have been submitted. A new submittal requirement is a school board resolution acknowledging that the remaining School Facility Program (SFP) bond authority is currently exhausted for the funds being requested.

Once the OPSC has reviewed the required documentation it will be placed on a State Allocation Board (SAB)-acknowledged list of new construction and modernization projects that are received by the OPSC. The new list will be called the "Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List."
