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#### Goal 4



Topics covered will range from: Suspension/Expulsion; Section 504; Attendance with a focus on Mental Health; Wellness Centers; and much more. A focus will be around special populations including, but not limited to: foster youth; homeless youth; LGBTQ+; and newcomers. Attendees will leave empowered to navigate their frontier, equipped with best practices, research-based strategies, and provided with tools that may be implemented immediately upon return to their school and/or district.



Diablo USD As we work through post-pandemic services to meet students' needs, districts and county offices of education increasingly face scarce resources. This session will focus on creating ways to integrate mental health supports in schools and identify new partnerships to help serve the whole child. This session will discuss strategies and partnerships necessary to support integrated teaming, how this approach is part of California's Community Schools and Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiatives, and how to braid funding and services to create sustainable student outcomes.



Diablo Unified School District This session will give an overview of the Best Interest Determination meeting process for Foster Youth and McKinney-Vento students, including legal requirements and best practices for implementation. The complex transportation needs of students will be discussed, as well as ideas for cost-sharing, and navigation of complex cases.

This session will describe processes for providing Foster Youth and McKinney-Vento students with the academic, social-emotional, behavioral, and basic needs resources they require to engage effectively in school.
