What is the CARES Expanded Learning Program?

CARES is a K-12 Expanded Learning Program offered at 17 MDUSD Schools

- Began in 1999 with six school as a school/community partnership
- Primarily funded by the CDE After School Education & Safety Program Grant, + local grants, and district categorical funds
- Traditionally serves approximately 2300 students every school day and during a four week summer session at high need schools
- Focuses on enrichment, recreation, nutrition, STEM and academic support
- Offered in partnership with Bay Area Community Resources (BACR)

CARES participating 17 MDUSD Schools

In-Person Program

In-Person Program began March 25, 2021 at 12 elementary and 3 middle schools

- Serving approx. 56 students per school (28 group A, 28 group B) from 2:30-5:30 M/T/Th/F
- Following all district and CDC safety protocols
- Focused on:
 - Enrichment, engagement and team building
 - STEM and Math hands-on activities
 - Physical activity, nutrition & garden education
 - Academic skill building by Teacher Liaisons
- Morning learning support hubs currently at Cambridge, Meadow Homes and Ygnacio Valley Elementary



Distance Learning Program continues

Began March 2020 at all 17 schools

- Focused on:
 - Take & Make hands on activities
 - Online activities and enrichment via <u>CARES YouTube</u> page and each school's CARES Class Dojo
 - Assist with MDUSD meals and food distribution from C.C. Food Bank
- Partner with teachers to offer virtual enrichment activities to classes
- Book check-out system
- Live Zoom Science Club through National Inventors Hall of Fame
- Sports for Learning online PE and SEL

In Person


- Offered at approximately 15 schools
