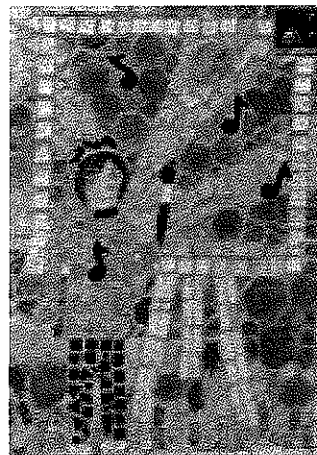

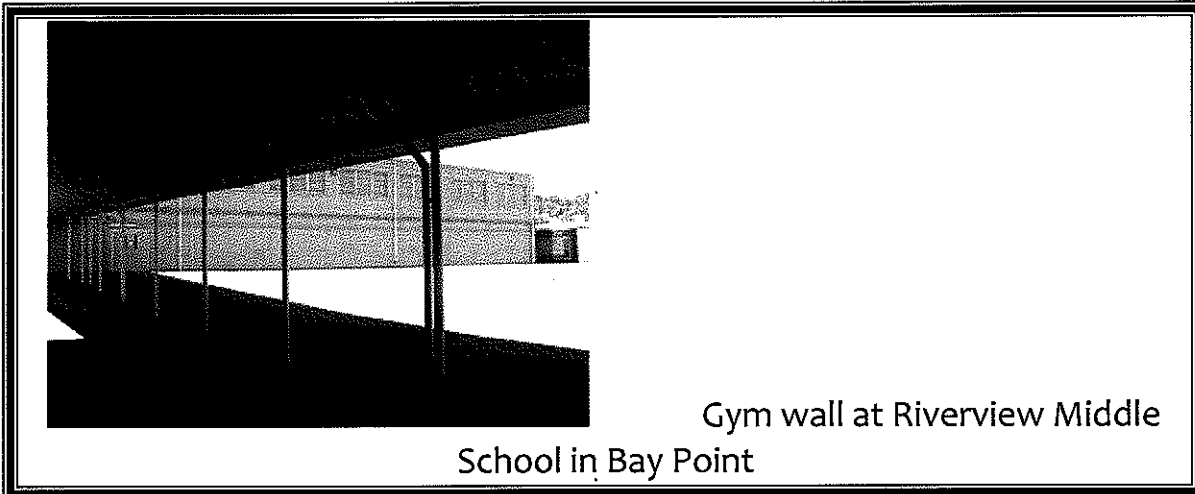

This grant proposal is for six (8 by 12) large Student Hand-Made Tile Mosaics to be permanently installed on the outside of the new school/community gym in Bay Point.

history and facts about the site: Riverview was founded in 1956 and is an important landmark in Bay Point. The modern, new gym and track field were built in the last five years. Many of the parents of students went to Riverview when it was originally a high school. The school is the only secondary school and gym in Bay Point and much used by the community for meetings and sports events and concerts to name a few events that happen at the school. Riverview Middle is part of Mount Diablo Unified School District. Riverview middle campus houses: Bay Point Public library, Bay Point Community Gardens, Mental health Collaborative, Bay Point Family Health Center, a day care, an after school program and a continuation high school.

project proposal: (see page 1) I am making the drawings for the six mural including drawings from art students in my six art classes at Riverview. The ceramic class will make the tiles, impress designs/textures in each tile and glaze them so there is a palette of colors to make the mosaics. Each of the six classes will put the tiles on the gym walls (about 300 students) and there will be at least (depending on interest) three Saturday work days were their family and community will be invited to help put the tiles up and grout. We will do this in May once the rainy season has passed

(Hopefully) The result will be six, permanently installed, new, large, mosaics on the outside of the gym.

Students will learn a new art technique. They will see the start and finish of a public art project of their own on their own school. The mosaic will be here for many years and they will have a history with the school now. Students will see how if you start something (a drawing) and believe in what you do then it is possible to make something

(six colorful mosaics). They will participate in this year long process and see how it has its ups and downs and really takes hard work for the final results. The goal of making a school mosaic is to involve students in their school by creating a positive school climate and community climate. We are looking to provide a service learning opportunity for students at Riverview, a title one school with 78% of the students eligible for free lunch. Students will see the application of what they are learning in their art program, is valued by the adults around them. Their art will become part of their environment at Riverview Middle School in Bay Point. They will be encouraged to take ownership of the process and pride in their contribution to it. The responsibilities incumbent on those who succeed in these mentoring roles, as well as the permanent nature of the final mosaic installation, will serve to strengthen the understanding of their position in, as well as their influence on, the broader community they navigate.

Community needs addressed by the proposal: Putting 6 mosaics on the school gym is more than just art on a school wall but art that will be part of the Bay Point community. Mosaics are colorful and will last as long as the gym building. The value to the community is there will be art added, created by the children of the community. They will be creating, building and not destroying with gang graffiti and gang affiliations in the community that has to be painted over by the custodians. Bay Point is a low-income area. I remember when I first applied for a teaching job at this school thinking how drab and colorless the building was. I didn't want to teach at this school... though so much positive things go on inside the school that having it overflow with art to the outside is showing the community not just telling them what can be done and is being done at this school.

The 6 mosaics are about: improving the quality of life in a community, and enhance the human experience of the natural or urban environment.. That is what the six mosaics will add to the environment. I am enclosing an example of the mosaic we made inside the school so you will have an idea of what it will look like when completed. There is the permanent result of six mosaics but then there is the process that everyone is a part of for a year that the whole school and community witnesses or a part of that is

just as important. The process equals the product in adding "to the human experience" I think it is also very important that this mural is made by the children in this community who are very impressionable and need to see beauty and art as being important, valued, appreciated. It is there art that will be appreciated and it is ultimately they that are appreciated.

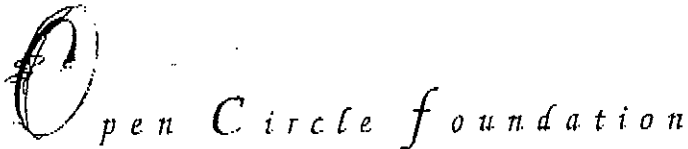

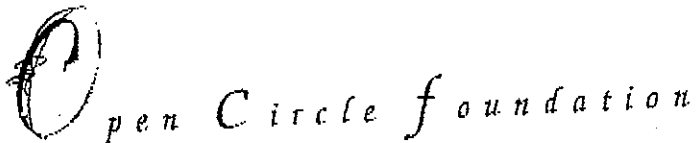
