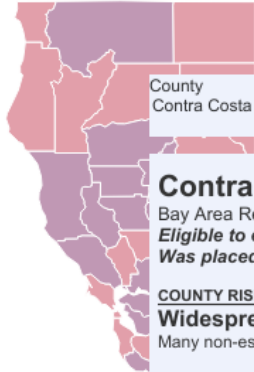

# PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (cont.)

- Sites are sent mass quantities from our warehouse bases on enrollment numbers, staff numbers, and specific types of classrooms.
- Some items are intended for specific staff based on job tasks.
- Items are for educators in classrooms and office staff.
- If a site runs low, they can request more from the warehouse.

Standard Operating Procedures  
Custodial Sanitizing Procedures - Level II

It is the policy of the Mt. Diablo Unified School District to keep our sites in clean and sanitary conditions. In an effort to increase the enforcement and consistency of our sanitizing and disinfectant measures, our custodial staff will implement the following procedures:

### EXPANDED SANITIZING PROCEDURES (LEVEL II)

If Influenza type symptoms are present in student or teacher, or if suspected exposure to confirmed COVID-19 individual:

1. Daily & Evening Procedures will be completed (Level I Procedures).
2. Deep Clean Process of Classroom identified and shared spaces.

### ALL PURPOSE CLEANERS/DISINFECTANT/SANITIZING PRODUCT(S)

All Purpose Cleaner: Hillyard Rubusto 42 or Equivalent

Sanitizer: Hillyard Rubusto 42 or Equivalent

Disinfectant: Suprox - Heavy Duty Peroxide Cleaner 37 or Equivalent

Disinfectant: Cole Supply - Lemon Q

Reminder: Disinfectant should not be used when children are present and must be kept out of their reach.

### PROPER PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Custodial staff must wear gloves and safety glasses when applying the disinfectant.



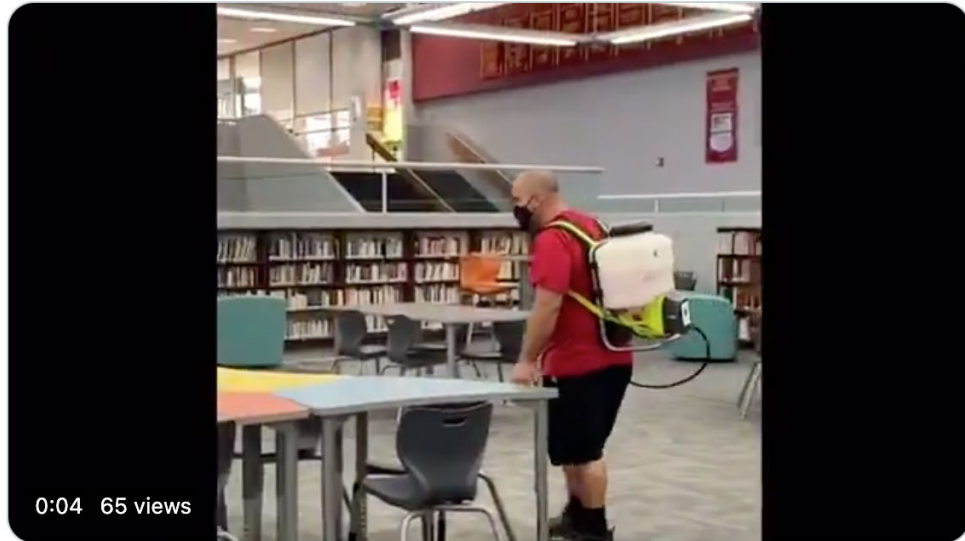

# Adequate Ventilation

- High efficiency MERV 13 filters are recommended by the CDC (Center for Disease Control).
- Recommend replacing quarterly.
- 1,341 that were on backorder - delivered to sites on Friday of last week.
- For rooms where HVAC is not working and there is no MERV 13, we will relocate the teacher. If no relocation space is possible, we will make available an air purifier.

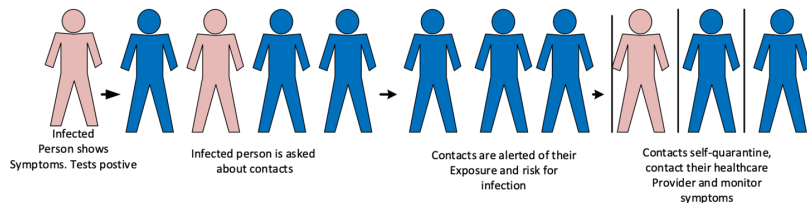
