1. <b>SCIENCE LAB CHEMICAL INVENTORIES</b> [Aurora will formulate a listing of chemical compounds used in school science programs to comply with Ed Code 49411, Science Safety Handbook for California Public Schools, 2014, Edition, and the California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 8, Section 5191, Occupational Exposure to Hazardous Chemicals in Laboratories.]			
2. <b>HEALTH AND SAFETY INSPECTIONS - SCIENCE LABS</b> [Aurora will conduct health & safety inspections at the middle and high school science laboratories to evaluate compliance issues and hazard risks in accordance with various health and safety regulations including California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 8, Section 5191, Chemical Laboratory Standard; California Fire Code, Title 24; California Health and Safety Code, and Science Safety Handbook for California Public Schools (SSHB), 2014 Edition.]			
3. <b>CHEMICAL HYGIENE PLAN UPDATES</b> [The CHP manual will contain guidelines and procedures science and non-science employees are to follow to comply with California Code of Regulations, Title 8, General Industry Safety Orders, Section 5191 - Occupational Exposure to Hazardous Chemicals in Laboratories.]

5. <b>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INVENTORIES</b> [Aurora will conduct district-wide HMIs to comply with Title 8 of the California Hazard Communication Regulations, the Healthy Schools Act, and the Right to Know law. Hazardous materials are routinely stored in Custodial Locations, Maintenance and Operations, Buildings and Grounds, Woodshops, Arts/Crafts, Photography classes, Welding, Auto Shop, Health Office, Science & Biology Labs, Pools, and other areas / sites within the District sites. WEEKLY SHWCCAF INSPECTIONS [Aurora will inspect the Schools Hazardous Waste Collection Consolidation and Accumulation Facility (SHWCCAF) in Maintenance to ensure hazardous waste is properly managed in accordance with regulatory requirements as per Permit By Rule 66270.60(d)(7). (Time & Materials basis, estimated price is per month)]

8. HAZARDOUS WASTE REMOVAL [Aurora will segregate, pack, profile, label, manifest, transport, and dispose of science and non-science hazardous waste. Hazardous materials that are deemed hazardous waste by the end-user must be removed within 90 days. Part of an efficient and proactive environmental compliance program includes the ongoing removal of expired, unwanted, or prohibited chemicals and science experiment waste.
